Winter Parking Ordinance

Lakeville's winter parking ordinance is now being enforced. No cars can be parked on the street between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. even if it isn't snowing. There is also no on-street parking when it's snowing, until the roads have been cleared.

Recycle Your Holiday Lights

Don't throw your old holiday lights in the trash - recycle them! In Lakeville, drop-off locations include City Hall and all three Lakeville Liquor stores. Items accepted include holiday lights, electric cords, telephone cords and appliance cords. Items not accepted include cord adapters, battery packs, plastic rope lights and CFL lights. Deadline is January 31.

City Seeks Volunteers for Boards, Committees and Commissions

The City is currently seeking applicants for our advisory volunteer boards, committees and commissions. Appointed by the City Council through an application process, volunteers review policies and proposals in order to make recommendations to the Council, providing an essential connection between our residents and local government.

The City Council encourages residents to become part of the decision-making process by volunteering their time and talent for one of the following advisory boards:

Planning Commission

The Planning Commission advises the City Council on issues involving the establishment of and compliance with the Comprehensive Land Use Plan and the zoning, subdivision and sign ordinances.

Parks, Recreation & Natural Resources Committee

The Parks, Recreation & Natural Resources Committee advises the City Council on development of a Comprehensive Park, Trail and Open Space Plan; the development and use of parks and recreation facilities; and preservation of natural resources and promotion of environmental awareness.

Economic Development Commission

The Economic Development Commission assists with the development of a comprehensive plan designed to enhance the quality of, and provide balance to, the business and residential communities.

Finance Committee

The Finance Committee acts as the advisory body to the City Council and City staff regarding short- and long-term financial planning, financial policies and practices, legislative issues and education programs relative to City of Lakeville budget and finances.

Lakeville Area Arts Center Advisory Board

The Lakeville Area Arts Center Advisory Board advises the City Council on matters pertaining to the promotion, development and accessibility of the arts.

COUNCIL MEETING January 2, 2018

 The City Council approved a cooperative agreement with the City of Bloomington to provide public safety services during the 2018 Super Bowl.

 A Joint Powers Agreement renewal with the Dakota County Community Development Agency was approved for the Open to Business program, which provides technical assistance and access to capital for small businesses and entrepreneurs.

 The Council held a public hearing to consider annexation of approximately 199 acres of Airlake Airport into the City of Lakeville. Official action to annex the property will be taken at the January 16 City Council meeting.

 Public Works Director Chris Petree presented the Public Works quarterly report, which included two videos regarding environmental initiatives that were undertaken last year.
