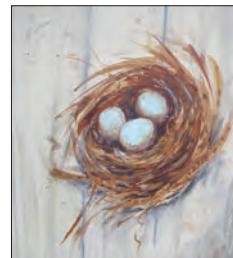

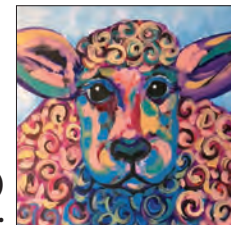

## City of Lakeville Conducting Community Survey

To better serve residents and to learn more about the needs of citizens, the City of Lakeville has partnered with the National Research Center (NRC) to conduct a community survey.

Invitations to participate in the survey will be mailed to a random and scientific sample of 1,600 Lakeville households on Friday, April 6. If your household receives this invitation, we encourage you to participate in the survey. A full survey packet will be mailed to you on Friday, April 13.

The survey is designed to provide a baseline of how our City government is serving

residents, to gauge perceptions of the City and to make comparisons with peer cities.

The survey includes questions about quality of life in the community, local policies, demographics, rating of local government services and resident use of services.

Survey results from this initial random sample will be weighted and analyzed. Once that process is complete, the survey will be open on Friday, May 11 in an online format for all residents to provide input.

## COUNCIL MEETING April 2, 2018



The City Council received a donation of \$10,000 from Minnesota Energy Resources

Corporation for the construction of Legacy Park, a neighborhood park located near the Legacy subdivision southwest of Dodd Boulevard and Cedar Avenue. An agreement was also approved with KA Witt for construction of the park.



A Joint Powers Agreement was approved with Dakota County for this year's Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off Day event on May 5.



The Council approved a cost share agreement with Dakota County for the purchase of electronic poll books to be used in this year's election. These electronic poll books are secure tablet computers that replace the current paper voter rosters, which will speed up lines at each polling place, help election judges through each step of the process (including election day registration), provide data on polling place activity and more.



A preliminary and final plat was approved for a 30,000-square-foot regional headquarters for Compeer Financial, a member-owned Farm Credit cooperative that is an agricultural lender. The building will be constructed at the southwest corner of I-35 and County Road 70. This new location will result in the consolidation of offices currently located in Apple Valley and Northfield.

## County Road 50 Reconstruction Project to Begin April 23

County Road 50 will be closed from 185th Street to Jaguar Avenue beginning Monday, April 23. The posted detour is 185th Street to Dodd Boulevard. Initial work includes grading operations and private utility relocation. Jaguar Avenue temporary bypass lanes are expected to be open between April 30 and May 7. City and County staff will coordinate local access with residents, schools and businesses adjacent to the project limits.
