Parks & Recreation

Kamp Kermit: Kamp Kermit is a place where kids can be kids while participating in a wide variety of activities, from games to music to arts and crafts. Preschoolers will make new friends and learn about good manners, the ABCs, playground safety, the environment and more. **For ages 4-6.**

Tiny Tots Soccer: This is an introductory program for children to learn soccer basics. Kids will work on soccer skills and play fun, soccer-themed games. **For ages 4-6½.**

STAFF UPDATES

Public Works

Construction began on Kenwood Trail/County Road 50 on Monday, April 30. Initial work includes grading and private utility relocation. The road will be closed from 185th Street to Jaguar Avenue. The Jaguar Avenue temporary bypass road is expected to open the week of May 14.

The Streets Division continued with spring street sweeping. All three of the City's street sweepers are out. One is focusing on the collector roadways, while the other two work through neighborhoods. This process usually takes 6-8 weeks.

The Utilities Division completed 551 Gopher State One Call locates in April and has completed 492 water meter replacements in 2018.

Park Administration/Maintenance

Fundraising efforts will begin soon for the future construction of an accessible 9-hole miniature golf course at King Park. Individuals representing the South Metro Miracle League, the business community and staff presented the proposal to the City Council at a recent work session. The Lakeville Lions have committed to donating \$75,000 towards the project.

Lakeville Area Arts Center

Arts Center staff met with representatives from the Minnesota State Arts Board in order to secure an operating support grant. If awarded, the grant would run for four consecutive years.
